- **Faculty of Arts & Education** – 5000 AUD (One off) – limited quota, please ask the representative for request if you have genuine students (not applicable for LPDP / other Scholarships student, not applicable for Pathways transfers)

Term & Conditions

1. Please kindly be advised that above bursary / study grant can't be combined with any other Scholarships, and do not require additional documents and assessment for the allocation.
2. Student need to apply for Direct Entry to UG / PG course, and obtain Full Offer Letter in order to be considered for a Grant / Bursary allocation.
3. Returning students; internal campus/course transfer; Monash pathway (except MADA for English & Dip Pt1; PHARM for MUFY); or Exchange/Study Abroad students will not eligible for the Grant / Bursary.
4. **Scholarship students under LPDP scheme is NOT eligible for study grants/fee reduction.**

Adjustment on Undergraduate and Monash College Entry Requirement based on KKM (Passing Mark) for SMU 3 Curriculum

As part of improving our student learning experience in Monash University and Monash College, there are some adjustment on Undergraduate and Monash College entry requirement based on KKM (Passing Mark) for SMU 3 Curriculum:

How to calculate the KKM & Entry Requirement?

Rules to calculate entry where there are more than 1 KKM passing marks on one transcript:

1. average the KKM to determine which grading scale entry scores to use

- 40% - applicable for those with KKM 40 to 42.49
- 45% - applicable for those with KKM 42.5 to 47.49
- 50% - applicable for those with KKM 47.5 to 52.49
- 55% - applicable for those with KKM 52.5 to 57.49
- 60% - applicable for those with KKM 57.5 to 62.49
- 65% - applicable for those with KKM 62.5 to 67.49
- 70% - applicable for those with KKM 67.5 to 72.49
- 75% - applicable for those with KKM 72.5 to 77.49
- 80% - applicable for those with KKM 77.5 to 82.49

2. Average the student's achieved score for all subjects to determine eligibility for entry.

Please calculate all the score in the Knowledge section and Practical Section, and then divided by numbers of taken units in Knowledge section and Practical section.

For example:

If there are 12 units in the knowledge section and 6 units in the practical section, then we need to calculate all the score in the knowledge and practical section and then divide the total score by 18 (Total units taken in Knowledge and Practical section)

3. for math pre-requisite, the KKM pass mark for the math subject will apply*)

*)For application to Monash University, the KKM guideline is the same with Monash College, and please use the attached files for your guideline on entry requirement based on KKM 65%, 70%, 75%. The entry requirement reflected on our new 2019 UG prospectus is for KKM 60%. Please contact us for further information on Entry requirement on any other courses, or KKM category that are not available in the attached file.

Monash College Diploma and/or MUFY offer many benefits for students' transitions to Monash University. The entry requirement to Monash College is slightly lower than Monash University.

In other hand, you also may suggest the student to take SAT Test, as Students who have undertaken an American Admission Test (i.e. SAT, AP or ACT) with another international qualification (equivalent to an Australian Year 12) will be considered for Monash University undergraduate admission, however the qualification OR American Admission Test with the highest achieved score will be used to determine whether the student has met the entry requirements.

FACULTY OF BUSINESS & MEDICINE NOW ACCEPT PREDICTED GRADES FOR ADMISSION

Cambridge International Examination (CIE) GCE A Level and International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Predicted Results Process for entry into Monash University undergraduate degrees:

Most Monash University undergraduate courses accept CIE GCE A Level and IB Diploma predicted results provided except *Bachelor of Physiotherapy & Bachelor of Medical Science & Doctor of Medicine*.

- the students actual results will not be available to the University from the relevant school or institution by the latest time at which admission decisions are to be made, and
- **the predicted results are provided in the form of a statement on the institution's letterhead, signed by the principal no more than 6 months prior to the Monash University first day of orientation date**, and
- the predicted results were obtained in a program at registered CIE Schools or IBO schools.

In addition to the above, predicted results can be accepted by Monash University Australia provided:

- The student predicted results is 2 points higher than the Monash University undergraduate academic entrance requirements, and
- The student has met all course prerequisites (including English) and extra requirements, and
- The student has provided the required information for the final results to be obtained through the following online verification systems as follows:
 - GCE A Levels - Cambridge International Examinations (CIE) Direct:

Students must provide their **centre number, candidate number**, date of birth and series (i.e. when the final examination was taken) along with their predicted results to Monash University Admissions.

- IB Diploma - International Baccalaureate Information System (IBIS):

How to submit the predicted result:

- the predicted results are provided in the form of a statement on the institution's letterhead, signed by the principal **no more than 6 months prior to the Monash University enrolment date**, and
- the title of documents should be : trial / predicted / forecast result

IB Certificate (Year 12) for entry to Diploma Part 2 in Business / IT

Student who already finish year 12 from IB institution, and do not take TOK, CAS, or EE are considered as **IB Certificate**, and now Monash can accept IB Certificate with bellow requirement :

Entry Requirement:

A minimum score of 26 and completion of a minimum of one subject from five academic subject areas, with no grade less than 4 for a Standard Level subject or 3 for a Higher Level subject and pre-requisites to apply

English Requirement: 4 for Standard Level English and 3 for Higher Level English

O Level Prediction Result for MCPL (MUFY / Diploma) Application:

**Diploma Part 1 with GCSE
Cambridge/Edexcel O Levels**

**Entry score min 15 (16 for
forecast results)**

Predicted for O Levels also accepted with one points higher and some prerequisite subjects applied.

How to submit the predicted result:

- the predicted results are provided in the form of a statement on the institution's letterhead, signed by the principal **no more than 6 months prior to the Monash University enrolment date**, and
- the title of documents should be : trial / predicted / forecast result

IB MYP (Middle Year Program)

The International Baccalaureate (IB) Middle Years Program has been approved for entry into MUFY - Standard, Intensive, Extended courses.

The below scores have been set for entry:

MC Course IB MYP

- MUFY Intensive 40
- MUFY Standard 32
- MUFY Extended 28

The grading scale is 1-7, where the minimum grade is 3.

Please kindly be noted, that the original certificate from IBO is mandatory, and we can't accept MYP certificate issued by the school.

Please kindly be noted, that some courses under Faculty of Medicine, Nursing, and Health Sciences are *quota based*, and it will quickly filled up. Therefore, if you have interested students in bellow courses, please kindly check the quota status regularly with the Country Manager and also accept the offer as soon as possible.

- Applicants must have completed an Australian bachelor degree or an equivalent qualification and a minimum of three years work experience (total) with at least one year of professional/managerial experience.
- Applicants will be ranked accordingly based on their entire academic record.
- Students will need to provide:

- A copy of your resume,
- Statement of purpose: A key characteristic of our MBA programs is the business experience our students bring. You'll need to include a one-page statement explaining why you're applying and what you can contribute. It should include whether you'll be sponsored by your employer.
- Employment references: Students must provide contact details of two professional referees in a position of seniority who can attest to your work experience.

Students must provide the following details of the referee:

- Full name
- Position title
- Company name
- Email
- Contact telephone number

Student may also be invited to attend an interview.

Master of International Business will be accepting students with last intake on July, 2018 intake, and start in February 2019, the course will be replaced with **Master of Global Business**

MONASH ART, DESIGN, & ARCHITECTURE (MADA)

The Faculty of Art, Design and Architecture have advised that additional requirements such as folios and preselection activities have been removed for all single and double degrees (except for Fine Art specialisation) effective from Semester 1, 2018 and onwards.

The only course that has addition requirements is Bachelor of Fine Arts - fine arts specialisation only as follows:

Fine art specialisation: You will be required to attend an interview and submit a digital copy of your folio. Go to monash.edu/mada/apply to register. Your final ranking for the fine art specialisation is based on a range of criteria – folio interview and ATAR or GPA. Please check study.monash.edu/courses for up-to-date Information before applying. Folio: Your folio should include 10 to 15 major examples of your best creative works and additional minor pieces. A well-presented folio demonstrates that you value your work and tells us we should value your work too.

Please note that the art history and curating and visual arts specialisations offered within the Bachelor of Fine Art do not have additional requirements (i.e. interview and folio are not required).

Change to existing program:

As you may know, starting in Semester 1, 2019 intake, Bachelor of Interior Architecture will be change by Bachelor of Design with specialisation in Spatial Design. The overall course focus will be the same with Interior Architecture, however the student may experience a combine studio focus between Spatial Design and other studio such as Communication Design or Industrial Design by taking the specialisation Collaborative Design.

Diploma of Design

- Diploma Part 2 (Art & Design) start in Semester 1, 2019 also removed the portfolio requirements, and
- The student join the Diploma in February, June, or October intake may progress to Bachelor of Design with specialisation in Collaborative design, Communication design, Industrial Design, and Spatial Design may progress to the Monash University in February and July intake upon completion of two trimester of Diploma Part 2 in Art & Design
- Student join Diploma Part 2 (Architecture) can only join in February intake, as the course duration for this diploma is only 4 months, and will progress to Year 1, semester 2, in the July intake.

EDUCATION

Applicants to Bachelor of Education and Master of Teaching must sit for CASper prior to application – start for application in Semester 1, 2019

The Faculty of Education has submitted Admissions Notification Form advising that the below extra requirement:

"All applicants must sit CASPer. CASPer is a requirement for many of the initial teacher education courses in Victoria. It is a non-cognitive online tool designed to assess an applicant's personal and professional attributes. To register for your sitting or further information visit <https://takecasper.com/>.
