UNDERGRADUATE INDUSTRY PLACEMENTS

INDUSTRY PLACEMENT

Industry placements provide students undertaking an undergraduate degree in the Monash Business School with first-hand experience integrating theory with practice in a business context. The placements focus on the major discipline area of your degree.

Monash can find undergraduate students a placement (paid or unpaid) in Melbourne, interstate, or overseas.

OR

Students can find their own placement (paid or unpaid) in Melbourne, interstate, or overseas.

Students can obtain 6, 12 or 24 credit points depending on the duration (providing it meets academic requirements).

BENEFITS FOR EMPLOYERS

Enhance their workforce by taking on students who:

- have up-to-date knowledge in the area in which the business operates
- are eager to apply that knowledge for the betterment of the business

BENEFITS FOR STUDENTS

Students will experience life in the workforce with the opportunity to apply the theoretical knowledge they have gained at Monash University

HOW WILL STUDENTS BE GRADED?

Students' tasks are graded for assessment.

These tasks are marked by Monash Business School and will include:

- Supervisor evaluation
- Student self-evaluation
- Oral presentation
- Reflective essay
- Portfolio of placement activities

PERIOD AND TIME OF THE PLACEMENT

The industry placement is for a minimum of:

- 20 working days 6 credit points (BEX3006/3106)
- 30 working days -12 credit points (BEX3012/3112)
- 55 working days 24 credit points (BEX3024).

This can be full-time or on an equivalent part-time basis (subject to agreement between the business, Monash Business School and the student).

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for an industry placement, students should have completed 96 credit points and have a credit average. Please note that places found by Monash are highly competitive and there is no guarantee that every student submitting an application will be successful.

Placements found by students need to be approved by the WIL Team and Academic Coordinators before enrolment to ensure they meet the unit requirements and Monash University guidelines.

REMUNERATION DURING THE PLACEMENT

Participating businesses are not obligated to remunerate students undertaking these programs. Some businesses may offer a nominal gratuity to students to cover expenses. Monash University carries insurance for students in this program, but this does not extend to students who are categorised as employees.
