TAFE International Western Australia (TIWA) is committed to providing international students with a safe and supportive learning environment. While on any campus of a Western Australian TAFE college or school, TIWA's premises or when engaged in any course related activity off campus; international students are expected to behave in a considerate, courteous and lawful manner when dealing with staff, other students and members of the public.

The behaviour expected of international students is outlined in the *International Student Behaviour Management Policy* and this associated *Student Code of Conduct*. In order to maintain your enrolment with TAFE International Western Australia (TIWA) you must comply with the *Student Code of Conduct*.

UNACCEPTABLE BEHAVIOUR/MISCONDUCT (NON-ACADEMIC)

International students must:

- 1. Treat all staff and students with courtesy and respect, regardless of physical, intellectual, racial, cultural or religious differences.
- 2. Be considerate of the opinions, life experiences and learning/teaching styles of fellow students and staff. Unwelcome, offensive, abusive, belittling or threatening behaviour directed at staff or students will not be tolerated.
- 3. Not engage in activities that contravene Commonwealth or State law.
- 4. Respect and care for all facilities and equipment used in the conduct of a learning program.
- 5. Present for learning in a fit and proper condition.
- 6. Seek prior approval from TAFE International Western Australia for any extended absence.
- 7. Make payment of all tuition, resource and materials fees by the due date.

ACADEMIC MISCONDUCT

International students must:

- 8. Maintain satisfactory course progress throughout the course.
- 9. Attend scheduled classes, actively participate and complete assignments and assessments as required.
- 10. Actively participate in all teaching and learning activities in a non-disruptive manner to other students and staff.
- 11. Ensure that all submitted work is the result of genuine efforts by refraining from plagiarising and copying from other people.
