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INTERNSHIPS AND PRACTICA

Counseling students are also required to complete 100 supervised hours of practicum in the CityU Counseling center, followed by 600 supervised hours of internship in the community, giving them relevant, hands-on experience.

ADMISSIONS

The Master of Counseling program at CityU is a competitive program with limited space available – if you are interested please contact an Admissions Advisor who will help guide you through the process.

REQUIREMENTS

- Any Bachelor's Degree from an accredited or CityU recognized institution.
- Overall GPA of at least 2.75 in Bachelor's Degree studies.
- Two professional and one personal reference letter, these must include name, title, email, and phone contact information.
- Writing sample describing professional goals and prior counseling experience (if any). Guidelines are attached to the application packet.
- English Proficiency: A bachelor's degree from an English speaking country, (defined by CityU policy) or English proficiency test score: TOEFL 87, IELTS 6.5, iTEP 4.5, PTE 59 or higher.

GENERAL APPLICATION DOCUMENTS:

- 2. \$50 application fee
- **3.** Original or certified copies of diplomas and transcripts (with certified English translations)
- **4.** Proof of English language proficiency (TOEFL, IELTS, ITEP, and PTE are accepted)
- **5.** Consent to release information (if applying through CityU's approved agents)
- 6. Copy of passport

- **7.** Bank statement and financial declaration form, plus sponsor statement, if applicable
- **8.** After arrival in the U.S.: Copies of I-94, visa, and entry stamp
- **9.** For transfer students coming from another U.S. college: International student transfer evaluation form and copies of I-20s
- **10.**Additional requirements may apply depending on program and start date.
