Airport pick-up

Before you leave home you can organise to be picked up from **Perth International Airport** and taken directly to your homestay family or temporary accommodation. This can be arranged by the **Australian Homestay Network (AHN)** at a cost of \$120. A taxi from the airport to central Perth costs approximately \$50. An airport bus (\$20) is also available and can drop passengers at central city hotels.

Accommodation

Hopefully you will arrive in advance of your course commencing to secure good accommodation, as per the date stated on your student visa. If you are staying in temporary accommodation and need to find permanent housing you can visit the **Accommodation section** on the TAFE International Western Australia (TIWA) website to review your options including rental accommodation, campus living villages and homestay.

Restaurants, cafes, and shops and more

Clarkson (Trades Training Centre) - This campus is located near to the [Ocean Keys Shopping Centre](#) and [Mindarie Marina](#), which contains several boardwalk restaurants.

East Perth Campus - Also known as the Resources Precinct, this campus is on the eastern side of inner city Perth, and the free city [CAT buses](#). It is located on the banks of the beautiful [Swan River](#) and surrounded by cafes and restaurants.

Joondalup (Kendrew Crescent) - Joondalup is an exciting city in Perth's northern suburbs. It contains a large range of cafes, restaurants and the [Lakeside Joondalup Shopping Centre](#). There are also a number of free events run by the [City of Joondalup](#). The campus is located in the Joondalup Learning Precinct, which includes the [Edith Cowan University](#).

Joondalup (McLarty Ave) - Located not far from the centre of Joondalup, there is a free [CAT bus](#) to transport you around the city.

Leederville Campus - Close to cafes, restaurants, shops and the Leederville train station there is a lot to explore in [Leederville](#).

Mt Lawley Campus - Located on the vibrant Beaufort Street café strip in one of Perth's most stylish suburbs. There are a number of exciting cafes, restaurants and shops to visit in [Mt Lawley](#).

Nedlands Campus - This campus is located adjacent to the [University of Western Australia](#) which has a variety of on campus dining options, and the nearby Broadway Fair Shopping Centre.

Perth (Northbridge) Campus - Located in the centre of the cultural area of [Northbridge](#) and close to the centre of Perth. All student visa holders must have Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) for the duration of their student visa. TIWA has a preferred provider agreement with Bupa. Students may obtain Overseas Student Health Cover from the provider of their choice.

Part-time work

Your international student visa lets you work in Australia; however, you are limited to the number of hours you can work – 40 hours a fortnight during each semester and unlimited hours during semester breaks. Tax File Number

If you want to work, you will need a tax file number (TFN). You can apply online at the [Australian Tax Office](#), this may take up to two weeks.
