# Our programs

Decide which program is right for you. Columbia College Secondary operates on a semester system. You can take 3-4 courses per semester. With three semesters per year, this means less time to graduate. You will have access to university level labs and services during your studies.



Senior Secondary (Grade 10, 11, 12)

This program is certified by the BC Ministry of Education. Graduates receive the same credential as any public high school in BC (BC Dogwood Diploma). This is the requirement for direct entry into a Canadian university. Students entering in May 2018 will follow the new curriculum proposed by the Ministry of Education. A Math Skills Assessment is required for graduation.

Students with strong grade 10 or 11 results can choose to accelerate their high school program. This program requires fewer courses for completion and allows students to proceed to the University Transfer Program at Columbia College. Accelerated students can transfer into 2nd or 3rd year at a Canadian university upon completion of their

University Transfer program.

Adult Secondary (Grade 11 & 12)

This program is for students who are over 18 years of age. Students will receive a BC Adult Dogwood Diploma, certified by the BC Ministry of Education.

University Preparatory

Tailored to each student's needs, this program provides missing courses for students who have completed high school but lack the prerequisites for their university studies. Normally just one semester long, students proceed into Columbia College's University Transfer program.

\*Prerequisite courses must be completed and may increase the number of credits required to complete the program. Subjective to new curriculum updates.

#### **Get ahead faster**

Our tri-mester system means you can start any grade in January, May or September. Complete high school in as little as 2 years.

#### **Dual Credit**

Take university level courses in high school and get credits for both university and high school at the same time.

#### **ENGLISH LANGUAGE CENTRE (ELC)**

Programs are offered part-time or full-time (25 hours a week) and cover core skills such as listening, speaking, reading and writing plus additional elective courses. Students in the ELC have full access to Student Services and college facilities.


Programs start 6 times per year with a minimum program length of 7 weeks. Once a student progresses beyond English 096, they can begin registering in a high school program and advance further into High School English.

# What's Next?

#### **University Transfer**

Take up to 60 credits at first and second year level at Columbia College and then transfer those credits to any university in British Columbia and across Canada. You will graduate with a degree from the university you transfered to.

British Columbia has the smoothest college-to-university transfer system in Canada. Advantages of studying at Columbia College's university transfer program include:

- Same courses and quality as a university.
- Columbia College instructors are personable and supportive with doors always open to meet with you.
- Small class sizes mean personal attention to each student and a closer relationship with instructors and classmates. Students will see a higher GPA as a result.
- A lower price for the same courses as a university.
- Columbia College charges the same tuition per credit, regardless of faculty.



#### Homestay & Custodianship Fees

Students can experience living with a Canadian family during their studies at Columbia College. Columbia College Secondary will only assist in making custodianship arrangements for students if they are placed with a Columbia College Homestay family.

All students who require custodianship must pay homestay fees in full for the entire semester (4 months) in advance. Homestay fee includes 3 meals/day at \$900 per month.


