## Nexus Theatre

Murdoch's professional theatre space provides Arts students with a dedicated area to refine their craft in both performance and production practices. Home to some of Western Australia's brightest emerging talents, this venue hosts community, musical, cultural and theatrical events; giving you the opportunity to turn your theoretical

knowledge into hands-on practical experience with a range of industry-standard work placements.

## Nursing Simulation Suites

Our Mandurah and Perth campuses both offer excellent nursing facilities. In fact, our Perth campus has the newest nursing facility of any university in Western Australia and, in the case of an emergency, can be used as an operational hospital.

Our dedicated nursing spaces include fully-equipped clinical teaching wards, treatment areas and simulation suites where, as a Nursing student, you will learn how to provide care under the supervision of technical simulation staff who, themselves, are registered nurses.

## Psychology Clinic

Our postgraduate Psychology students have the opportunity to work with real clients in our fully-operational Murdoch Psychology Clinic. Offering psychological services to the public, which range from baseline assessments to psychological therapy, you will benefit from first-hand experience in dealing with a range of cases and area specialisations.

## Renewable energy facilities

If you are a Renewable Energy student, you will learn from our industry-experts in our state-of-the-art engineering facilities, including an outdoor test area, photovoltaic research equipment and a renewable energy-engineering laboratory, housing a comprehensive range of wind energy industry-standard software.

## SimLab

As an Education student, you can make the most of our unique SimLab to get valuable teaching experience and feedback before you enter a real classroom.

As the first university to offer this simulated teaching experience in Australia, SimLab allows you to practice your teaching skills in a virtual classroom environment with avatars who respond in real time to your instructions.

## Sporting facility

You can make the most of your university experience with our recent \$5.2 million sporting facility upgrade, which includes two synthetic football (soccer) pitches, a cricket oval for summer cricket, new changing rooms, floodlights and spectator seating.

## Sports Science facility

If you are a Sport and Exercise Science student, you will learn in our recently upgraded \$4 million sports science facility. Fitted with the latest equipment, the three specialised laboratories, which include an exercise physiology lab, a performance lab and a rehabilitation, strength and conditioning lab, come complete with a climate and altitude chamber, motion capture systems, 50-metre running track and a fully-equipped gym with Olympic weightlifting facilities.

## Veterinary hospital and working farms

As the only city-based university to offer an on-campus farm, our Veterinary and Animal Science students get unrivalled hands-on experience across a range of industry settings. You can learn from leading industry experts in our on-campus farm, or graduate as a career-ready veterinarian with work placements and guided support in Murdoch's fully-equipped Veterinary Hospital, which comes complete with cancer, equine and dermatology clinics.

# Our campuses

## Perth campus

Located in Murdoch, just 15 minutes from the bustling central business district of Perth and the historic port city of Fremantle, our main campus offers all our courses along with dynamic teaching facilities, support services, specialised educational and recreational facilities and a unique student experience.

As one of the largest university campuses in Australia, our Perth campus boasts more than 227 hectares of beautiful bushland environment, providing our students with the ultimate Australian experience as they study alongside a range of native Australian flora and fauna.

Bush Court is the heart of our Perth campus. ## Mandurah campus

# Scholarships

Murdoch understands that studying at university can be a life-changing experience. As an International student, moving abroad to study can be a daunting task.

That is why we want to help. Offering a range of scholarships for commencing and existing International students, your pioneering mind can focus on the important things, like making the next big breakthrough in your field, while we take care of any financial hardships you may be facing.

Whether you are just starting out with your studies as an undergraduate, returning to study with a postgraduate degree or making ground-breaking discoveries as one of our research students, there are a range of scholarships to suit students from all backgrounds, disciplines and walks of life.

## International Welcome Scholarship

An International Welcome Scholarship can provide between AUD\$8,000 and AUD\$11,000 towards your tuition fees.

If you are studying a Bachelor of Nursing, or any eligible course under the School of Business and Governance, you may be eligible for up to AUD\$11,000. Students from all other eligible courses could be awarded up to AUD\$8,000.

Recipients of an International Welcome Scholarship will have the award amount paid into their student tuition account in four instalments over two years.

The International Welcome Scholarship is available for the 2019 intake period, for students starting their studies at one of Murdoch's Western Australian campuses. ## Financial Aid

## International Welcome Scholarship - Australia

If you are an International student currently living in Australia, an International Welcome Scholarship - Australia could provide you with a 20% discount towards your total course tuition fee.

The International Welcome scholarship - Australia is available for students who are:

- An international full fee-paying student residing in Australia at the time of application studying an undergraduate, honours, graduate diploma or master-level degree;
- Commencing studies at one of Murdoch's Western Australian campuses in 2019;
- Commencing studies in an eligible coursework program; and
- Not a recipient of any other Murdoch University scholarship.

## Your industry experience

### Work placements

Work placements are an opportunity for you to spend an extended period of time in an organisation where you will undertake genuine work tasks with workplace supervision. You will learn to integrate previously studied theory with its practical application in the workplace, developing a range of professional skills along the way. Depending on the discipline, work placements may also be referred to as internships, practicums, or clinical placements.

### Industry projects

Participating in an industry project means you will work as either an individual, or as part of a team, on a real project for an industry or community partner. Projects are usually completed on-campus, under the supervision of academic staff, but deliver on a brief from one of our real-world industry or community clients. As well as learning to integrate and apply previously studied theory, you will be able to develop your skills in project management, client liaison, and may be required to work in multi-disciplinary teams.

### Work simulations

With a work simulation experience, you will learn in an industry-standard learning environment that has been set up on campus. In consultation with industry, work simulations recreate as many of the complexities of a real work environment as possible. You will be provided with an opportunity to integrate theory and practice as you experience a simulated work environment, including prioritising multiple tasks, interpersonal dynamics, deadlines and other workplace pressures.

With the student experience as a core focus, the Village has an exciting residential-life program designed to help residents meet new people, succeed academically and develop essential life skills. Events include BBQs, themed dinners and parties, movie nights, sporting events and competitions, writing workshops and so much more.

The Village offers 24-hour staff presence, with resident staff members living on-site and night-time security patrols. There is a team of resident assistants responsible for organising events, assisting new students with their transition into communal living and ensuring adherence to Village rules. Staff also provide support to residents experiencing personal or study problems.

The Village also caters to students with disabilities, providing adapted apartments with modified bedrooms and bathrooms.

### Rates

The rates for 2019 range from \$150.50 weekly for a twin-share bedroom to \$397.50 weekly for a one-bedroom apartment, per semester. If you book your accommodation for the entire university year (42 weeks), rather than just one semester at a time, the rates will be cheaper.

## Off-campus accommodation

### Shared Accommodation

Many students often choose shared accommodation where several students share a unit or house near campus. Rent for shared accommodation is typically less expensive than on-campus accommodation, and may cost between \$120-200 per week. In most cases, you will have your own room but will share amenities, such as a kitchen and bathroom, with your housemates.

Students living together in shared accommodation will often have rules for inviting guests into the home, the payment of shared utilities such as electricity and water, and the usage and clean-up of common areas. In shared accommodation, it is important that all residents of the property understand and follow the rules that have been agreed upon.

Accommodation can come furnished or unfurnished. Unfurnished rooms may be cheaper to rent, however you will need to purchase any furniture that you will need such as a bed, desk, and chest of drawers.

Homestay accommodation allows you to live with an Australian family while you study. In most cases, you will have your own room but share amenities such as a kitchen and bathroom. ## Choosing the right accommodation for you

There are a number of factors you will need to consider when choosing your accommodation. In addition to the cost of rent per week, other things you may want to consider are:

- Is it furnished or unfurnished? If it is unfurnished, you will need to set aside additional funds to purchase furniture and other household items.
- How many people will I be sharing common facilities with? This may include a kitchen, bathroom, etc.
- How close is it to campus, public transportation, supermarkets and other shops?
- Are there laundry facilities on-site? If not, how close is the nearest public laundromat?
- What kind of heating/air conditioning is there?
- How secure and safe is the location? Are there locks on the doors and windows?
- Will it be noisy? Is it on or near a major road?

If you choose to live in shared accommodation, choose your housemates wisely. For example, if you typically go to bed early, you may not want to live with people who constantly stay up late every night. It is important that you meet and feel comfortable with any potential housemates prior to moving in.



# Student support

The Careers and Employment Centre is a professional support service available to Murdoch's current students and Alumni, offering assistance with finding work, enhancing employability through workshops, career events and mentoring programs, connecting graduates and students with industry professionals and offering a job application checking service.

## Equity and Social Inclusion Office

The Equity and Social Inclusion Office seeks to ensure the student experience at Murdoch University is free of discrimination and that all students are provided with an equal opportunity. The Equity and Social Inclusion Office coordinates a range of services for students, including disability services, language and cultural exchange programs, equity complaints and information on your responsibilities and rights as a Murdoch student.

## Support for Learning

The Support for Learning team brings together the areas of academic staff development, work-integrated learning, educational technologies, learning support and access programs.

Particular focus is placed on student learning, with support services including:

- Writing and academic workshops;
- Specialised postgraduate support programs;
- Peer Assisted Study Sessions (PASS);
- Peer Academic Coaches (PAC);
- UniEdge, a transition program to assist new students settle into tertiary study.

Additionally, there are dedicated consultants to assist International students with any literacy or numeracy issues they may be having.

## Student Advisors

Student Advisors are based in all schools across Murdoch University and provide help with any questions or problems you may have with your course, studies or university life.

## Student Centre

The Student Centre is a friendly and efficient hub located at Murdoch's Perth campus, where you can find out a range of information about admissions, advanced standing, enrolments, examinations, fees, graduations, student support, Open Universities, parking and payments and general student administration enquiries.

## Student Guild

The Student Guild offers students opportunities to get involved in student life and to be part of the wider West Australian community. The Guild can help you with a range of services from clubs and societies, finding off-campus accommodation, volunteering opportunities, social events and much more.

## Childcare

Murdoch offers childcare facilities. The Murdoch University Childcare Centre provides care for the children of students while they're studying and is conveniently located on site at our Perth Campus.

## Murdoch Academic Passport (MAP)

## Murdoch Institute of Technology

Murdoch Institute of Technology (MIT) is conveniently located at Murdoch University's Perth campus. Facilitating organised interactions with university life, and allowing students to experience all that university has to offer, MIT provides a friendly and supportive environment for all students.

MIT offers the Murdoch University Preparation Course (MUPC), which has been designed in collaboration with Murdoch University's academic staff to ensure the best possible preparation for students' success in a wide range of Murdoch University degrees. The MUPC is accredited by Murdoch University, with successful completion guaranteeing entry into the majority of Murdoch University's undergraduate courses.

## Diploma offerings and structure

MIT offers diploma programs in three areas:

Each diploma requires completion of eight units over two or three trimesters, with some of the prescribed units forming the core of specific Murdoch University degrees. All of the units offered as part of MIT's diploma programs have been taken from the current Murdoch University syllabus, providing students with credit and exemption for up to one year of an undergraduate degree at the University. Academic staff at MIT will assist students with unit selection. All diplomas have been designed to provide students with a broad and relevant knowledge base in preparation for a range of undergraduate degrees at Murdoch University.

MIT also caters for students who want to improve their academic English skills for entry into undergraduate and postgraduate studies. The Murdoch Language Centre offers courses that allow direct entry into the MUPC, Diploma Programs and Murdoch University.

### Programs offered include:

- General English (elementary to upper intermediate)
- English for Academic Purposes (intermediate and above)

MIT and Murdoch University accept graduates of the English for Academic Purposes program into their academic programs without requiring an IELTS test (unless otherwise advised), provided that the student completes the program at the required level.

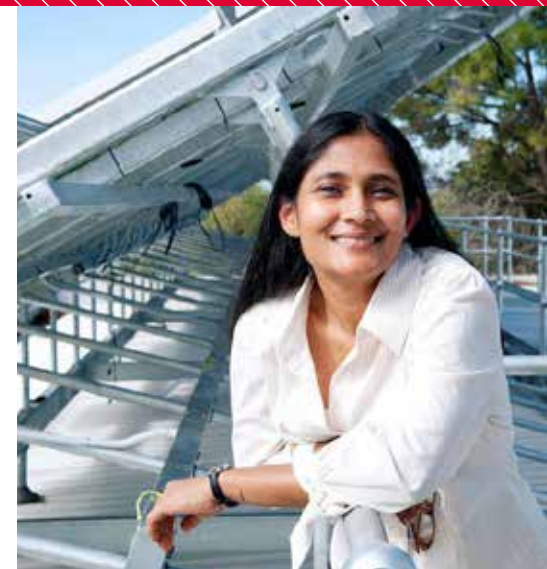
## Dr Tania Urmee

**Combined degree** - Offering a unique learning experience, at Murdoch you could have the opportunity to study two majors at once, broadening your career prospects. However, for those wanting to graduate with even more of an advantage, we offer combined degrees. A combined degree allows you to study a combination of two separate bachelor degrees, where you will graduate with two distinct award qualifications.

**Course core** - A set of required units and specified electives that form part of the completion requirements in some courses. The course core may make up the entire credit point value of your course or may be designed to support studies across a range of majors.

**Major** - An extended sequence of units in a specialised area of study that is recognised on your University degree certificate. You can explore all Murdoch majors over the next section of this guide.

**Options** - Credit points left after you have completed the compulsory parts of your degree and major. Choices might include taking an additional major, a co-major, minors and/or general electives.

**Additional major** - Where your course includes options you may have enough credit points to take an additional major.

Sometimes called a double or second major, an additional major is another major that you study as part of your degree. Depending on what you choose, undertaking an additional major may increase the time required to complete your course.

**Co-major** - A sequence of units in a specialised area of study but with less depth than a major. Co-majors are available as an option in some undergraduate courses and are recognised on your University transcript.

**Minor** - A short sequence of units in a particular area of study that is available as an option in some courses and is recognised on your University transcript.

**Unit** - The subjects that you study within your course. Each unit has a code and a name. You can study required units, compulsory units that you have to do; specified electives, units on a list that you can choose from; and general electives, any units from across the University that you meet the pre-requisites for.

**Murdoch Career Spine** - A unique career-enhancing group of units or experiences designed to give you the skills and attributes employers are looking for and the tools to plan for and manage your career.

At a minimum, to qualify for one of our postgraduate degrees, you must meet one of the following requirements. Please note that entry requirements are dependent on the course you wish to study and as such, your specific course may have different entry requirements:

- A qualification equivalent to an AQF Associate Degree
- Bachelor's degree of AQF Level 7 in relevant discipline
- Bachelor's degree of AQF Level 7 with relevant work experience
- Bachelor's degree of AQF Level 7 with specific professional registration
- Postgraduate qualification of AQF Level 8 or above
- Submission of a Portfolio and/or substantial work experience

# FAQ's

### 1. Do I need a visa to study in Australia?

Yes, you do require a visa to study in Australia. However, the visa type you require will depend on the course you plan on studying and duration of time you wish to spend in Australia.

### 2. Will I need to get health insurance while I'm studying in Australia?

As an International student studying in Australia, it is compulsory that you take out Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC). The Department of Immigration and Border Protection (DIBP) requires you to organise OSHC through a registered health provider that has been approved by the Australian Government. OSHC is important for you, as an International student, as it provides cover for you should you ever need medical treatment (doctor appointments, ambulance cover, hospital visits, etc.), potentially saving you thousands of dollars in medical bills.

The following students are not required to take out OSHC:

- A Norwegian student covered by the Norwegian National Insurance Scheme
- A Swedish student covered by Kammarkollegiet
- A Belgian student covered under the Reciprocal Health Care Agreement with Australia

### 3. I want to travel through Australia for a while before I start my study, will it matter if I miss a few weeks of class?

Yes, it will matter if you miss a few weeks of class. As an International student you are expected to maintain satisfactory attendance and progression throughout your chosen course, as stipulated by the conditions of your student visa. Assignments, examinations and essential information are provided to you within the first few weeks of class and missing any of this time could greatly affect your overall course progression.

### 4. How do I know what prerequisite subjects I need to take at high school in order to get into my desired Murdoch degree?

Murdoch University recommends you select secondary school classes that you will enjoy and do well in. While our courses have no prerequisite subjects for high school leavers, a high level of English competency is required for entry into Murdoch. If you are unsure about what classes to take in high school, Murdoch offers recommended subjects that are dependent on what tertiary course and career path you wish to follow.

### 5. My IELTS scores aren't high enough but I really want to study at Murdoch, what can I do?

If you don't initially meet the English Language Requirements for direct admission to Murdoch University, you may consider applying for entry through one of Murdoch's alternative entry pathways. These pathways consist of courses offered through the Murdoch Institute of Technology and other similar off-campus partner providers, where you may undertake a variety of courses with a focus on English and STAT preparation and testing.

### 6. I will be under 18 years of age when I start studying at Murdoch, how will this affect me?

Being under 18 when you start your studies at Murdoch should not affect your study life in any way. However, there are a few extra precautions you have to take to make sure you are following the conditions of your student visa. You must stay in accommodation accompanied by either a parent or legal custodian, a close relative or a non-relative that has been approved by the university. Additionally, consuming alcohol under the age of 18 is illegal in Australia and you may be denied entry to some venues where alcohol is served.

### 7. When do my fees have to be paid?

As an International student you will need to pay part of your course fees when you first accept your offer. Following that, tuition fees need to be paid in full prior to the commencement of each semester for the units you are enrolled in for that semester. As a rule, fees are due the Friday before the start of each teaching period.

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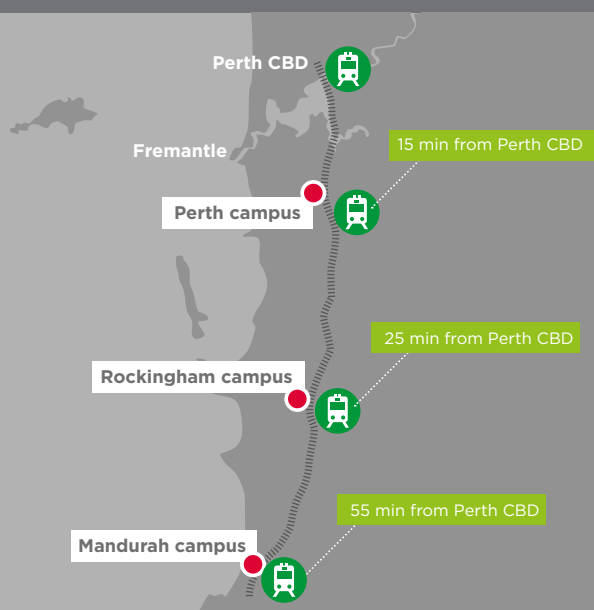
