- Successful completion of a New Zealand Certificate in English Language (Level 4) programme is an acceptable equivalent


Hospitality Industry

This involves the procurement of highly durable materials used for furniture and appliances designed to be used by a wide range of people across hotel and resort chains. Quality is an issue with all products, but the primary focus in hospitality procurement is longevity and replacement; making professional procurement decisions critical for this industry.

Medical Industry

In several countries pharmaceutical expenditure makes up a large proportion of health spending. This makes the cost of supplying and purchasing medicine and equipment a significant contributor to the total cost of health care. It is essential for organisations, in both the public and private sectors, to develop systems that optimise on this cost segment for efficient procurement.
